

## eport on Proceeding of Research Convention

#### **Executive Summary**

The 12<sup>th</sup> research convention of the institute on the theme 'Pre and Post Perspectives of Research' was held on 4<sup>th</sup> March 2017 at the University campus. The convention focused on educating and guiding the research scholars belonging to various domains of the institute towards quality research. About 149 research scholars (both M.Phil. and Ph.D.) of various disciplines participated and benefitted out of the programme. Eminent speakers from various institutes across India shared their expertise on topics such as ethics in research, methodology, literature review, statistical analysis, article writing for Scopus journals, and journal indexing.

The highlight of the convention was one to one interactive session organized for research scholars with subject experts of their domain, which provided them a platform for discussing their specific research topic in detail and modifying the objectives and methodology towards quality research work in the right direction.

#### **About the Convention**

The one day UGC sponsored Research Convention was organized on the theme 'Pre and Post Perspectives of Research' for the benefit of research scholars of the institute. Today, higher education institutions are producing doctorates in large number, but their novelty and originality of research is questionable. Therefore, Avinashilingam Institute for Home Science and Higher Education for Women, which is known for value based education and uncompromising standards in all fronts had been organizing series of research conventions in order to ensure quality research work among research scholars. The 12th convention of the institute addressed the issue of substandard research work by sensitizing the scholars on the need for ethics in research which would ultimately lead to quality research output.

Research, when undertaken seriously is a difficult task. It requires comprehensive understanding of the domain subject, its applications, methodology, documentation, and publication. Generally, anybody finds themselves as lost in the sea, when they start the research work looking for some guiding stars or lighthouse to lead them in the right direction. They look for guidance at each stage – from selection of the research problem to thesis writing. Hence, this convention had provided a platform for the research scholars to carry out their work with more clarity and conviction.

#### Objectives

- To sensitize the research scholars on the importance of ethical research.
- To familiarize the research scholars with research basics and resources.
- To motivate and encourage quality journal paper publications.
- To provide research scholars an opportunity to discuss their specific research problem / issues with the subject experts.

#### **PROCEEDINGS**

#### Inauguration

The convention began at 9 am by invoking the blessings of God Almighty.



Dr. V. Saradha Ramadas, Professor & Head, Food Service Management and Dietetics and co-ordinator of Research Convention welcomed the dignitaries, invitees and participants with her bouquet of words to the convention. She explained the purpose of the convention and assured the participants of a better learning experience. She further insisted the research scholars to make the best out of the programme.

Followed by the welcome address, Dr. P. R. Krishnakumar, Chancellor delivered the presidential address. At the outset, he appreciated the organizers on conceiving such event and wished the scholars good luck. During his address, he highlighted that significant research in general has far reaching impact on the society. What was traditionally called as 'logical reasoning' has been rechristened as 'research'. When it comes to research we generally perceive that the western scientists have outperformed Indians. But, how did great science like Ayurveda was found in India? Research was practiced by our ancestors in varied forms.



Research is 'not having faith in past and rechecking if we can prove or disapprove it'. He quoted about three types of eyes as quoted in the popular book 'The Third Eye' by Lobsang Rampa. According to the author, the first eye is 'the biological eye' which acts like a microscope to scan objects around us; the second eye is 'the mental eye' which keeps the thought process active and the third eye is the 'eye of consciousness' which is also called as 'inner eye' which refers to invisible eye which provides perception beyond ordinary sight. It is the subconscious awareness of the surroundings and interactions of the environment. Human beings need to be aware of the happenings around him/her using 'third eye' as the internal tool. The citation from 'The Third Eye', would have opened the 'two biological eyes' of all participants to kindle their thought process in all verticals through their 'mental eye' and to analyze and make sense using the third eye – 'the inner eye'. This process would not only bring success and laurels to oneself but enable oneself to taste the impeccable 'self-actualization' which is the sole purpose behind God's creation of mankind.

He also recorded that west has started coming to India for various sciences. Ayurveda invented by Indians have been proved after series of test and henceforth declared by UCNA as an alternative treatment system to be accepted worldwide. India had witnessed great scientist in the past and is going to witness in the future too....But what is lacking is the quality of research at present. He stated that 'You are an equipment of yourself' and remarked that research is not just in laboratories. Astrology, Vastu, Yoga are also sciences that have emerged as outcome of research. He also emphasised about the uniqueness of the institute in the context of research activities and concluded with remark that 'We are different...We are far above others'.

Dr. M. Daniel, Principal, SNS Rajalakshmi Arts & Science College, Coimbatore delivered the inaugural address. He insisted that though research is common to everyone, the methodology varies and accordingly provide varied results. He discussed at length on the types of research and emphasized that research needs both 'theoretical and Empirical' concepts. According to him, 'In Science, Theory and Experiment should go hand in hand'. He also clarified on the purpose of doing research by various categories of people such as students to get a degree, passion lovers who pursue research out of love and curiosity, and professionals as a part of their career. One need to understand clearly the purpose of research and should have a clear vision about it. The spirit of research need to evolve out of passion and from one's inner mind. Research is boundary-less.... it can be pursued anytime and anywhere. He also narrated his personal incident of becoming a researcher. Quality research comes out of passion and publications are not only measure of quality work. Research needs to be taken to common mankind in the society in the form of stories and concepts that are simpler to understand. Researcher needs to have curiosity, creativity and innovativeness in order to correlate theory and application.



Dr. Daniel further explained about 'Theory of Relativity' proposed by Albert Einstein way back and its application to many novel things in the present. He further remarked that 'Mahatma Gandhi is the best innovator as he thought that Ahimsa and Satyagraha could also bring peace unlike nonviolence. He quoted few innovative scientific ideas and its conceptualization. Further, he expressed his sympathy that in spite of great institutions like IIS, AIMS, IITS fostering research, we are still lacking quality research publications in China are five times ahead of India and in terms of research power, we have four per 10000 labourers which is far behind the under developed Kenya which has six per 10000 labourers. Therefore, we have a long way to go. In his concluding remarks, he insisted that in-depth research have to be taken up by scholars with passion in order to contribute to quality research.



Later, Dr. Premavathy Vijayan, Vice Chancellor offered her greetings to the convention. During her address, she reiterated that life of Chancellor itself is a research. She further explained the idea behind the event and that the experts from various parts of India would help in refining the research work of the scholars. Vice Chancellor briefed about the legacy of the institution since its inception and highlighted that research was nurtured in the institute from its inception. She further insisted the scholars to carry out 'application oriented' research such that it can be carried out to common man. She also spoke about the nuances of statistical tools and its interpretation. She also expressed that the institute would be ready to support the scholars with necessary infrastructure and environment for pursuing quality research. She concluded with tons of wishes to the organizers, experts and research scholars.



Post tea, Dr. Chitra Sivasubramaniam, Asst. Professor (SG), Dept. of English introduced the immediate speaker Dr. Deepika Bhaskar, Deputy Dean – Research, The Research Council of India, New Delhi.

#### **KEY-NOTE SESSIONS**

Dr. Deepika Bhaskar delivered a session on 'Ethical Perspectives of Research' during which she discussed the length and breadth of ethics in undertaking research. She opened her session with traits and components of academic values, principles and integrity. She explained non-integrity with case examples of research crime worldwide along with its consequences. She emphasized the role played by 'Office of Research Integrity' across the countries. She highlighted on some of the indigestible research facts that more than one third of scientific information on internet is incorrect;85 percent of investment in biomedical research is wasted due to inadequate reporting and half of the published research cannot be replicated. She further spoke on 'Plagiarism' and its types. She spoke elaborately on 'intentional' and 'unintentional' plagiarism. Dr. Deepika explained ways to overcome plagiarism by giving proper citations wherever required and in the manner required.



Her slide on 'Responsible ways of using internet' was quite interesting in the google dominant research era and she emphasized on the need to have their own 'Academic Integrity Policy' for the universities to produce quality research outputs. Further, she explained various types of research misconduct with examples of 'retracted articles'. Code and policies for research ethics and necessity of ethical approval was strongly recommended by the speaker. She concluded with re-emphasis on the ethical principles such as honesty, objectivity, integrity, carefulness and openness. Each slide of Dr. Deepika Bhaskar was loaded with useful information which served as a treat to both eyes and minds of the scholars.

The next keynote session on 'Research Design and Problem Identification' was dealt by the eminent speaker Dr. Sudha Ramalingam, Professor, Dept. of Community Medicine, PSG Institute of Medical Science and Research, Coimbatore. The speaker had three fold agenda of discussing the importance of problem identification, designing good research questions and choosing appropriate research design for the study. She gave valuable inputs to scholars regarding identification of research problem with practical examples from her domain of medicine. She also insisted that the criteria for research questions should be FINER (F-Feasibility, I-Interesting, N-Novel, E-Ethical and R-Relevant). In the latter part of her address, she focused on the various types of research design such as Observational and Interventional along with its sub-categories. Each type of design was well explained with a practical example along with colourful slides providing treat to the eyes as well. The pros and cons of each type of design was well delivered to the scholars and this session was short, informative and knowledge enhancing.



Prior to lunch, one to one interactive session by the domain experts with research scholars was organized at their respective department venue which provided a platform for the scholars at various stages of their research work to clarify their doubts and take guidance for proceeding ahead with their research work. The domain experts were introduced by the staff co-ordinators of various department before the start of the interactive session.

#### **Technical Session - 1**

Post lunch was the session on 'Formulation of Research Proposal' by Dr. A. Sharada Devi, Emeritus Professor, Department of Apparel and Textiles College of Home Science, Acharya NG-Agricultural University, Hyderabad.



In her opening remarks, she described research proposal as a tentative plan which helps the researchers to structure their thoughts and ideas. She further dealt with various types of research along with real-time examples. She discussed the contents of the research proposal step by step starting with abstract, introduction and background which includes the objectives and description about variables of the study, Methodology, Tentative plan, data analysis, significance of study and finally time frame of the study in the form of a Gantt Chart. She made an interesting comparison that the introduction is like face to human body, objectives are the heart, methodology and analysis is the body and finally conclusion is like the legs which bears the whole weightage of the research work. The do's and don'ts of each section of the proposal presented by the speaker was of real significance to research scholars in fine tuning their preliminary work.

In totality, the scholars got a 'holistic' picture of preparation of their research proposal. She concluded with a strong note that 'If proposal is well drafted, research is half done as it serves as a blue print that leads researchers through various stages of their research work'.

#### Technical Session - 2

The next session was presented by Dr. B. Vanitha, Registrar I/C of Bharathiar University, Coimbatore on the topic 'A Review on the Review of Literature'. She started with the significance of review of literature, purpose of doing review and the contents of literature review. She proposed a structure for presenting the review in a tabular format which would provide the details of collected reviews in a nutshell. She further elaborated on organizing review either based on chronological order or based on trends /history/geographical basis or based on thematic way. Dr. Vanitha also presented few examples of writing reviews from her scholarly experiences. She concluded her session with different referencing styles for reviews.



Dr. P. Parvathi Easwaran, Former Dean of Home Sciences, Avinashilingam University for Women deliberated on 'Preparation of Research Articles for Scopus Journals'. Her initial few slides covered on 'Scopus' and significance of writing journal articles which are indexed with 'Scopus'. She quoted that 'If your research is not published, it does not exist'. Also, she discussed about the need and stages in scientific publishing. Topics such as peer review and its importance, types of manuscript, choice of journal for publication, language of manuscript, impact factor, H index and order of manuscript were presented clearly with relevant examples.

#### **Technical Session - 4**

The last session on 'Importance of Indexing of Journals and Impact Factor' was dealt by Dr. P.R. Padma, Professor, Dept. of Bio-Chemistry, Avinashilingam University for Women. The presentation started with the need for publication and where to publish. She highlighted that today 'publish or perish' has been transformed into 'publish in indexed journals or perish'. She stated that 'indexing' is nothing but quantifiable parameters of performance for both journals and authors. The quantifiable parameters are indexing, impact factor, citation index, h-index and recent one being g-index.

Dr. P.R.. Padma listed the various indexing bodies of journal for various domains such as web of science, scopus, Google Scholar, Econlit, Index Copernicus, PsycInfo, SCIRUS etc. She further gave an example of impact factor calculation and cautioned about fake impact factor publishers. She insisted the scholars to consider the impact factor published by Thomson Reuters which is universally acceptable and known for its standards. Interesting part of her presentation was that she demonstrated the way to get h-index from Google scholar and also discussed on g-index. She also demonstrated the E-databases of the university along with its various links and insisted scholars on productive use of the resources available in the campus.

### REPORT

A training program was jointly organized by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and Department of Psychology for the Teaching and Non-Teaching staff of the Avinashilingam University on 20-10-16 in the Seminar Hall of Dr. Rajammal P. Life- skills strategies like Time-Management, Decision Making, Positive Thinking, Healthy Lifestyle and Humor were reiterated as a requirement for stress-free life. Components like negative self-talk, self-criticism; pessimistic thinking and over-analyzing were taught to be disregarded. The staffs were encouraged to develop a good interpersonal relationship with optimistic thinking, engage in social etiquettes of appreciation and acceptance of compliments.

They were trained in managing their stress through deep-breathing, relaxation, laughter therapy, smile therapy and tension releasing exercises. This was greatly appreciated by the participants both teaching and non-teaching staffs on the whole, conducted by Dr. N.S. Rohini and Dr. S. Gayatridevi respectively.
