



Figure 1: Students Feedback on curriculum

TEACHERS FEEDBACK

Teachers play a decal role in shaping the future of the student as well as development of the institute. In the year 2017 to 2018, faculty members gave their feedback about the institute. The feedback from the teachers revealed the validity and adequacy of the syllabus. The inputs received from internal members and external experts were quite helpful in reframing the course content. Teachers were in favour of regularity in the conduct of internal tests, semester examinations and also prized the teaching and research facilities for the smooth conduct of academic activities. Analysis of the report on adequacy of the syllabus offered for a particular course was strongly agreed by 48.5% of the faculty and 48.5% agreed and remaining 3% were neutral. When questioned on whether the aims and objective of the syllabi was met by the curriculum, 58% strongly agreed and 42% of the faculty agreed. The inputs received from external and internal experts about the reframing of curriculum was useful was strongly agreed by 64%, agreed by 35% and neutral by 1% of the faculty. Facilities for teaching and research were adequate were strongly agreed by 45%, agreed by 46%, neutral by 8%. Regularity in the conduct of tests and examinations were strongly agreed by 58% and agreed by 42% of the faculty. The faculty felt that the projects and research facilities were good and they motivated many students to do projects and research in the other research institutes and it was strongly agreed by 36%, agreed by 53%, neutral by 10% and disagreed by 1% of the faculty members.







Figure 1: Teachers Feedback on curriculum

- Employability skills may be improved to find the apt placement after their completion of the course.


Conclusion




FEEDBACK






Figure 1: Alumni Feedback on curriculum


