### **Competency of Teachers**


Competent teachers do not challenge students to achieve, they challenge themselves to create such learning environment where every student is a willing achiever





Fig-1: Overall satisfaction of students regarding the competency of teachers




Fig:2 Overall satisfaction of students regarding the Equitable Assessment




Fig:3 Overall satisfaction of students regarding the Opportunities for skill Enhancement and Growth


### <u>m</u> Infrastructure Facilities




Fig:4 Overall satisfaction of students regarding the Infrastructure Facilities




Fig:5 Overall representation of satisfaction of students regarding the integration of information and communication technology tools used

#### Overall Satisfaction of Students regarding the Efforts made by the Institution in promoting Sense of National Integration, Social Harmony




Fig:6 Overall representation of satisfaction of students regarding the efforts made by the institution in promoting sense of national integration, social harmony
