Details of activities conducted

Women's Studies Centre and Department of Health Sciences of SNS College of Allied and Health Sciences, Kurumpapalayam, Coimbatore conducted an "Awareness Programme on Gender Sensitization" for the students of SNS College of Allied Health Sciences, Kurumpapalayam, Coimbatore on 26.7.2022. Mrs.R.Sudha, Assistant Professor, Department of Psychology handled the session on "Social Emotional Learning for Young Adults". In this session she explained the concept of Social-Emotional Learning (SEL) as an integral part of education and human development. SEL is the process through which all young people and adults acquire and apply the knowledge, skills, and attitudes to:

- develop healthy identities
- manage emotions and
- achieve personal and collective goals
- feel and show empathy for others
- establish and maintain supportive relationships, and
- make responsible and caring decisions

Mrs.N.Selvanayaki, Project Assistant of Women's Studies Centre handled the session on **Gender Roles and Responsibilities**. In this session she explained with examples of what are gender roles? Gender roles in society means how we're expected to act, speak, dress, groom, and conduct ourselves based upon our assigned sex. For example, girls and women are generally expected to dress in typically feminine ways and be polite, accommodating, and nurturing. Gender roles and responsibilities of men and women are created in our families, our societies and our culture. Gender includes the expectations held about the characteristics, aptitudes and likely behaviors of both women and men. A gender role is a set of behavioural norms associated particularly with males or females in a given social group or system

Most children learn to categorize themselves by gender by the age of three. From birth, in the course of gender socialization, children learn gender stereotypes and roles from their parents and environment. Traditionally, boys learn to manipulate their physical and social environment through physical strength or dexterity, while girls learn to present themselves as objects to be viewed. Social constructivist argue that differences between male and female behavior are better attributable to gender-segregated children's activities than to

any essential, natural, physiological, or genetic predisposition.

A Questionnaire was prepared and information related to the topic dealt before and after the session was collected. Most of the students expressed that they learnt new ways of thinking for the future for themselves for the betterment of family, siblings, relatives and society. The students were of the opinion that individual development is the power for the society and family development. A total of 36 girls and 32 boys participated and benefitted.

Details of activities conducted

An Awareness Programme on Reproductive Health Care for Adolescents was organized jointly by the Red Ribbon Club, Department of Tamil and Economics and the Women's Studies Centre on 14.10.2022.

Key points discussed by the speaker Dr.T.Nalini

Menstrual Hygiene

- Menstruation is a normal process in a woman and starts during Puberty till menopause. Every month, the uterus sheds the lining and is excreted out of the body. A normal menstrual cycle lasts for about 21 to 35 days.
- Various methods of personal hygiene practices to be followed during the menstrual period were also discussed.
- The speaker also gave awareness about the social taboos related with Menstruation.

Cancer

The speaker gave information about the breast and cervical cancers among women. The preventive measures of getting vaccination against Human Papilloma Virus was also advocated that women below the age of 15 require 2 doses and women above 15 years

require 3 doses of the vaccine. The idea of annual health checkup for women particularly for breast cancer after the age of 30 years and the concept of self breast examination was also advocated by the speaker.

The Awareness Programme on POSH Act 2013 by MJF Lion H. Mathivanan, Advocate, Coimbatore was organized for the Teaching and Administrative Staff on 8.12.2022 at 9.45 a.m in the Academic Council Hall. Dr.T.Geetha, Director (i/c), Women's Studies Centre welcomed the gathering and introduced the guest speaker.

The session mainly focused on creating awareness to all members on the Sexual Harassment Policy of the Institute (A public document) and the Constitution of the Internal Compliant Committee (ICC) both of which are available on the Institute website, updated every three years. Sir stressed that all faculty should possess a copy of the Policy and the contact of ICC Member Secretary be put up in significant locations within the Institute for the students to become aware of the same.

In an Educational Setup, Sir focused on the duties of the employer – be it from the administration to that of the Head of the Department, the Teacher involved or the Bus Driver dropping the students home safe. The Role of the Institute in providing a safe environment was highlighted by the speaker by underlying the difference between a Local Compliant Committee and an Internal Compliant Committee of an Institute.

He stated the Roles, Responsibilities and Procedures involved in registering a compliant to that of bringing justice to the individual, submitting the compliant and without any bias closing the case without prejudice to both parties involved or as the case may be. The importance of submitting a NIL report, with no pending complaints, maintaining records of the reported cases with six copies of the same with no external influences, maintaining confidentiality of the issue till the closing of the case was clearly explained by the invited Speaker.

The session came to an end with a few clarifications to questions raised by the faculty and the information that 181 was the Helpline available in any given situation for women to seek assistance and lodge any compliant. With a brief feedback from the participants and a formal vote of thanks the session was considered very informative and significant to all stake holders in a working environment of the Institute. Totally 55 Teaching and 10 Administrative Staff participated and were benefitted.


Dr. Vani Ayyasamy oriented the students on the topic "Step up - Breast Feeding, Key to Sustainable Development".

She initiated her talk enabling an understanding the role of breast feeding in managing the burden of malnutrition. The statistics on infants being breast fed across the infancy period was projected. The chief guest's address focused on Optimum breast feeding which prevents 2 lakh infant death annually. The difference between animal and human milk created a strong impact on the significance of breast milk. The benefits of breast feeding for the mother and infant served as a factor to create and spread awareness to all the young mothers. The Risk of Artificial Feeding including malnutrition, bonding interference, over weight, anaemia was highlighted in the lecture. The significance of colostrum- Liquid gold, rich in antibodies serves as the first vaccine for babies. The importance of breast feeding in terms of duration, frequency, night feeding was detailed in the presentation. The top 10 food groups including greens, nuts, protein, pulses considered essential for lactating mother was also discussed. Consumption of five groups per day is clinically recommended for healthy lactation. The Antenatal classes are increasing the proportion of young mothers being oriented towards the essence of breastfeeding. Dr. Vani Ayyasamy concluded her address with a note of promise to "**Promote, Protect, and Support"**.

Dr.SG.Sujatha, oriented the participants on "Breastfeeding – The Best Feeding" and stated the uniqueness of breast milk and its usage to infants. The special circumstances in breastfeeding were mentioned. The guest concluded with a say "cow's milk is for body growth and human milk is for brain growth".

The event concluded with Words of Gratitude delivered by Dr.T.Geetha, Director (i/c), Women's Studies Centre.



Details of activities conducted

Details of activities conducted
