



She gave us a lecture which we will be very useful for all the UG,PG and Ph.D Scholars. This programme provided an opportunity to gather knowledge.
















Screenshots of the lecture on "Awareness of research opportunities"

INTRODUCTION TO SPEAKER:



REPORT ON BREAST FEEDING WEEK CELEBRATION -2022

On the 3rd of August, 2022, in the Hi-tech hall of Avinashilingam Institute for Home Science and Higher Education for Women, Department of Food service Management and Dietetics along with Indian Dietetic Association, Coimbatore Chapter organized an awareness lecture on "Importance of Breast Feeding and Breast Milk Donation", under the theme for the year "Step up for Breast Feeding: Educate and Support".

The lecture began at 11:00 am by invoking God's Presence through a prayer song led by S.P. Gayathri, S. Shri Ranjani and S. Sathyashri, II-B.Sc. Students from the Department of Food service Management and Dietetics. Following them, N. Komathy, Research Scholar from the Department of Food service Management and Dietetics extended her warm welcome to the gathering.

The program went on with the Presidential address rendered by Dr. N. Vasugi Ma'am, Professor and Dean, School Of Home Science. Ma'am addressed the participants through her valuable words and also asked them to advocate breastfeeding as an essential part of good nutrition, food security and poverty reduction. The Social Research volunteers of Coimbatore Dr. Madhuri Ravindra Kumar and her group of volunteers also participated in the program.

Dr. Premala Priyadharshini Ma'am, Professor and Head, Department of Food service Management and Dietetics greeted the audience. Ma'am emphasized on the natural feeding to be encouraged and the newborns to be fed with breast milk. In this regard, ma'am rendered a short awareness for the future mothers on the importance of breast feeding where it is very much essential to promote adequate growth, development and prevention of mortality among children.

Our Head of the Department, Dr. Premela Priyadharshini ma'am stated that breastfeeding practices in India needs immediate attention as rate of initiation of breastfeeding within one hour of birth is 57% while exclusive breastfeeding rate remains about 58%. Further, 66% of the infant deaths occur during the first year of life. This is often caused by inappropriate feeding practices.

Mrs. Roopa Selvanayaki, founder of Amirtham Foundation, Tirupur delivered the Special address. Through her talk the students were educated on the importance of breast feeding the health issues of premature babies, physiological changes in lactating a baby, breast milk as a bond between the mother and the baby, care of breast before and after feed, contents of breast milk, difficulties encountered in

breast feeding and its treatment. Ma'am also highlighted on the difference between breastfeeding and complementary feeding. Keeping this in mind and to raise awareness regarding the importance of breastfeeding, this special lecture was conducted for II UG and III UG girls.

Few points emphasized by the speaker in her lecture.

Breastfed babies have:

- Stronger immune systems
- Less diarrhea, constipation, gastroenteritis, gastroesophageal reflux and preterm necrotizing enterocolitis (NEC)
- Never not undergo respiratory illnesses like pneumonia, respiratory syncytial virus (RSV) and cough
- Fewer case of bacterial meningitis
- Better vision and less retinopathy of prematurity
- Lower rates of infant mortality
- Lower rates of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS)
- Overall lessens illness and less hospitalization

Breast milk provides abundant and easily absorbed nutritional components, antioxidants, enzymes, immune properties and live antibodies from mother. Mother's more mature immune system makes antibodies. These antibodies enter her milk to help protect her baby from illness. Immunoglobulin A coats the lining of the baby's immature intestines helping germs and allergens from getting through the body. Breast milk also contains substances that naturally soothe infants.

Breastfeeding is healthier for a mother in the following physical ways:

- Promotes faster weight loss after child birth and to maintain milk supply.
- Stimulates the uterus to contract and return to normal size.
- Lessens the risk of postpartum bleeding and postpartum depression.
- Fewer urinary tract infections.
- Lessens the chance of anemia.

- Lowers the risk of breast cancer and ovarian cancer.
- Lowers the risk of rheumatoid arthritis and lupus.
- Lessens endometriosis, osteoporosis with age, diabetes, hypertension and cardiovascular diseases.

The session was very much interactive. Later the lecture ended with the vote of thanks rendered by J. Yoshia Leela, Research Scholar from the Department of Food service Management and Dietetics. After the awareness lecture students were willing to create community awareness, benefited through this awareness lecture. Overall Master of the ceremony was taken over by S. Sanufiya, II-B.Sc. from the Department of Food service Management and Dietetics. Total of 172 beneficiaries were benefited through this awareness lecture.

REPORT OF WORLD FOOD DAY CELEBERATION

The Department of Food Service Management and Dietetics and Indian Dietetic Association - Coimbatore Chapter organized a Seminar on "LEAVE NO ONE BEHIND" as part of World Food Day celebrations on **OCTOBER 16th 2022** at **2:30 p.m.** in the Hi-Tech Seminar Hall and the audience included the students from the department of Food Service Management and Dietetics and Food Science and Nutrition.

The Seminar started with a invocation song by Ms. S. Vishalalshmi, II MSc Food Service Management & Dietetics Department. The welcome speech was delivered by Ms. H. Sneaga, II M.Sc Food Service Management and Dietetics Department.

The report on World Food day 2022 activities conducted by the department was deliberated by Ms. M.Diwan Haseena ,II M.Sc Food Service Management and Dietetics. In par with the themes of world food day: LEAVE NO ONE BEHIND. The department of Food Service Management and Dietetics had organized a series of programs that aimed to spread awareness and imbibe knowledge on diversified food and how it can be reached to the vulnerable groups in the society.

Competitions held

- In E poster making competition students showed there creativity and talents by make a theme based E poster on "leave no one behind".
- The second activity was a photography competition where in the student had covered pictures on the theme "No poverty to prosperity. The students showed their best capturing skills.

Madam greeted the gathering by quoting the significance of food. The need and value of sustainable development in current dilemma of COVID-19. She elucidated on the contribution of the local farmers and the importance of reducing the carbon footprint.

Dr. V. Premala Priyadharshini, Head of the department, Food Service management and dietetics, introduced the chief guest, Dr. Subba Rao M Gavaravarapu Scientist and Head of Nutrition

Information, Communication and Health Education, NIN, Hyderabad, the speaker of the Seminar. The title of the seminar was Advocating for food and nutrition security (Leave NO One Behind).

The Chief Guest commenced the presentation by focusing on the contribution of major disease groups to total DALYs in India, 1990 & 2016.

He elaborated the change in food and nutrition scenario in India.

- Triple burden of malnutrition
- Centuries old tradition verses development in food production, processing, distribution, and consumption.
- Increased consumer awareness in food safety
- Rising middle class
- Higher literacy rate
- Clearer food packing
- Modernizing retail
- Media campaigns, Advertisement.

The kniw how of the global strategies are focusing on hidden hunger, Dietary diversification, Fortification, Supplementation. He conveyed that these strategies combine lead to a little and slow progress in India.

Minimal meal frequency- The minimum number of time children should be fed solid, semi solid or soft foods or milk feeds are-

- 2 times for breast fed infants 6-8months.
- 3 times for breast fed children 9-23 months.
- 4 times for non-breast-fed children 6-23 months.

Minimum acceptable diet = Minimum Dietary Diversity

+

Minimum Meal Frequency

Sir presented few graphs related to minimum diet diversity of children from below 2-4 years

- Percentage breast fed withing one hour of birth
- Percentage with minimal dietary diversity.
- Percentage with minimal meal frequency.
- Percentage with minimal acceptable diet.

The graphical representation of diet diversity of children aged 2-19 years.

He also shared a conceptual frame work for developing countries showing the pathway of achieving sustainable strategies of dietary diversification to improve micronutrients status.

Sir shared a flow chart on food system diversification to enhance food system resilience where he mainly highlights

- Local/regional diet diversity
- Local/regional trading diversification
- Field, farm, landscape or region diversification.
- And he concluded that these factors are interrelated.

Sir concluded by questioning and suggesting ways

- Ensure equal access to social protection be responsible in our food choices
- Support small holder farmers by purchasing from local foods.
- Grow some of your own food -kitchen garden
- Donate food instead of wasting
- Encourage food banks or relief organizations.

At the end of the program, the prize winners for the various competitions held for World Food Day were awarded their prizes. The delivery of Vote of Thanks was done by Ms. N. Nithyasree IInd M.Sc FSMD.

The seminar was a learning experience for the students to imbibe the knowledge of food diversification. The students made use of this seminar an informative session which can bring in a change by following the theme LEAVE NO ONE BEHIND. The session motivated the student to take sustainable actions for better Food Security of the community.







REPORT ON DIETETICS DAY CELEBRATIONS

The year 2023 has been declared by the United Nations as the International Year of the Millet, following a proposal by India, which wants to position itself as a global hub for millets. The National Dietetics Day, as it is called, was conceived by the INDIAN DIETETIC ASSOCIATION as an annual event on January 10. This year the theme of the NDD was 'Mighty millets & 3As (Availability, Accessibility & Affordability) for sustainable development'.

The Department of Food Service Management and Dietetics, Avinashilingam Institute of Home Science and Higher Education for Women organized a series of events to mark the Dietetics Day, with the objective to create awareness and impact on food safety and nutritional knowledge among the publicn on the theme RETURN OF MILLETS – IMPACT ON NUTRITION SUSTAINABLITY

COMPETITIONS HELD:

The first competition was The Best Dietitian, wherein the students were assessed on their understanding of human physiology, pathology, nutrition science, and their ability to comprehend the same to therapeutic nutrition. The competition had three rounds of filtration and the participants were the Fsmd department. First round was the quiz round, participants who qualified according to the criteria were sent to the second round that is preparing for the Case study. The third round was to present the case study. 50 students participated in the Best Dietitian competition.

The topic for these were Wonders of millet and Sensitizing youth for the magic millet respectively.

SCREENING CAMPS AND COUNSELLING

The Department of Food Service Mangement and Dietetics organized screening camps and diet counselling sessions for wholesome route of treatment through preventive screening diet and exercise.

A one day Cancer screening camp was conducted at the University health center by partnering with Sri Ramakrishna institute of oncology and research. A total of 100 staffs and non teaching staffsof various school of the University would be benefited from the same.

As a part of the dietetics day celebrations a health check up was conducted with partnership with Tulsi pharmacy. Diet counselling was also provided by the students for various conditions including anemia, PCOD, PMS, and obesity. A total of 150 students professors and administrative staffs under went the check ups and counselling.

DIETETICS DAY CELEBRATION:

A Lecture on the topic "Return of millets – Impact on Nutrition Sustainability" was organized by the Department of Food Service Management and Dietetics on 10th January 2023 at 2:30 P.M at Hi Tech Seminar Hall.

The event embarked with a prayer by Prageetha J of 1 st B.Sc F.S.MD. Mayura Priya from 3rd B.Sc FSMD rendered the welcome address. The occasion was bedecked by the presence of the Dean of

Home Science Dr. Vasugi Raja, Dean of Student Affairs Dr. S Uma Magheswari and the Guest, Dr. Kalpana Bhaskaran, Deputy Director, Industry Partnership and Head Glycemic Index Research Unit

The report of the events conducted for Dietetics day was read by Mahima Magdelene III BSc FSMD. Further Dr N.Vasugi Professor and Dean, School Of Home Science delivered the presidential address. Ma'am asked the students to focus on spreading the message of healthy diet to the community and to be the flag bearers of a healthy community. Dr. Premela Priyadharshini, Professor and Head, Department of FSMD addressed the gathering and brought in the pressing need to make healthy and sustainable diets accessible and affordable to everyone.

Dr. Kalpana Bhaskaran, Deputy Director, Industry Partnership and Head Glycemic Index Research Unit, was the chief guest of the day spoke about the importance of organic and its urgency in today"s pollution and increasing health crisis. Further, she spoke about the process of reviving the healthy food habits, through discovery of nutritional and medicinal effects of millets, the Indian Traditional Healthcare that can eradicate the existing some of the sicknesses and diseases. She made a statement, "WHEN DIET IS WRONG, MEDICINE IS OF NO USE; WHEN DIET IS CORRECT, MEDICINE IS OF NO NEED". The right kind of food, a simple lifestyle and the right agricultural practice are what the society needs to mend its ways and get itself into a healthy state. She expressed that over the past few years there has been a healthy food revolution, especially, with the increasing health consciousness among people, there has been a rise in the demand of nutrient rich cereals and millets. She strongly feels that only millets have become favourite food fad among millenials for its umpteen health benefits. Enriched with the goodness of nature, millets are a rich source of fibre, minerals like magnesium, phosphorous, iron, calcium, zinc and potassium. Millets are extremely nutritious and good for health and they also need less water and can be stored for years, as they have a long shelf life. Millets make for a perfect healthy meal. The antinutritional aspects of millets were also briefly spoken about. She illustrated the fact that the processing of millets if indirectly proportional to its nutritive value.

Finally she said that the students mandate is not only to carry out some research in different fields and develop projects for the benefit of the State but it works as a catalyst for bridging the gap between institutions as well as colleges & Universities to promote and transfer technology for the betterment of the society.

After that Dr. S Uma Magheswari gave away the prizes to prize winners of the various activities conducted by the department.

The Webinar was ended by Vote of Thanks given by Ms Zeenath S. In the lecture around 200 Teachers, Students, Academicians and Researchers participated.

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
REPORT SPECIAL LECTURE NUTRIGENOMIC APPLICATION IN DISEASE PREVENTION AND MANAGEMENT

The Guest of Honor, Ms. Aditi Dev, Nutrigenomic Project Manager, Navi Point Health. The lecture aimed to create awareness by spreading information on Nutrigenomics.




The event began with a prayer by Prageetha of I BSc FSMD. The welcome address was delivered by Ridhivarthini M of PG Diploma.

Ms. Aditi Dev explained briefly on Nutrigenomics and precision nutrition medicine. She




explained various components of the study of genes.


She moved onto talking about the gut microbiome and why it's important to maintain gut health. She explained that nutrigenomics identifies the key areas of the problem and why it is problematic and the treatment depends on the individual person and not on general methods.




She threw some light on how genetics and the environment are connected and how they cause diseases based on the mutation of the genes and the condition of the environment which can cause diseases such as diabetes, obesity, cardiac diseases, infertility and PCOS.



Ms. Aditi Dev also explained how the MTHFR gene could help in diagnosing the amount of folate the body is receiving which is extremely important in the process of conceiving.



Ms. Aditi Dev gave a brief information on the impact of food on genes and how the altered genes in return change the normal metabolism in humans.




She also explained about the possible genes and how they cause the common diseases and disorders found and methods which can be adopted to cure them.



She also gave an exmaple of how the liver with its biochemistry performs detoxification activity by various reactions and how the altered genes does this activity.



She concluded the session by summarizing her presentation and requested the students to focus more on the basics and understanding of the body and focus on biochemistry of the body rather than concentrating on the major nutrients required by the body. This was followed by a Q and A session where students and staff asked their questions and received answers by Aditi Dev on various topics varying from a career in Nutrigenomics to the expenses of the tests required to conduct research for a particular individual.



The successful program came to an end and was recorded to look back and relearn.

Around 240 participants benefitted from the program.

extended her warm welcome towards the gathering. Mam emphasized the significance of going back to

an ayurvedic diet to halt the rise of non-communicable diseases including obesity and diabetes mellitus,

as well as other related concerns. Mam encouraged the students that in collaboration with

Avinashilingam Institute for Home Science and Higher Education for Women and AVP Research

Foundation to build holistic health approach for the future generation. Following with that, Mrs. Poonada

Krishna Prasana, Research Scholar from the Department of Food service Management and Dietetics

introduced the resource person of the day, Dr. Somit Kumar, Director AVP Research Foundation.

In the technical session, Dr. Somit Kumar began his lecture by emphasizing the importance of food

and diet and sir pointed out basic principles of ayurveda. Ayurveda classifies the matter (Dravya) as

living (Chetana) and non-living (Achetana) where living (Chetana) further classifies based on the

response to stimulus (Bhahiyachetana and Anthachetana). Sir pointed out the fragmentation of matter

(Dravya) as casual matter (Karana Dravya) which is responsible for creation and can't be fragmented

further which includes direction, time, mind, consciousness, space, air, fire, water and earth. The functional matter (Karya Dravya) is of temporal nature and lasts only for a period of time.


Sir then explained different casual matter (Karana Dravya) – the 5 basic elements (Panchamahabhuta) which are the building blocks of the whole world. Ayurvedic medical science believes that the whole human body and its every composition are also madeup of these 5 basic elements of nature. He then illustrated each elements: ether, air, fire, water and earth, its properties, characterization, level of experience and personality and at the end sir also underlined the correspondence of elements with modern physics and the composition of characteristic of each sense organ in human body on the basis of these elements.

Sir, concludes his session by underlining the importance of food, the food one eat matters everything. One will be healthy if one consume a good diet, and miserable if one don't. Active mind and consciousness give you good health and wellbeing. It is emphasized on doshas depending on Pancha mahabhutas. So, diet intake should be in balanced form neither aggravates nor pacifies doshas in the body. In Ayurveda, dosha are the governing principles of physiology and psychology. They are the primary and essential constitutional factors of the human organism. They maintain the integrity of the human body. The three dosha at physical level vata, pitta, and kapha vitiate different body tissues (dhatu) and can lead to diseases in disequilibrium state. They are the actual intrinsic factors which become excited and imbalanced, either conferring a predisposition to or actually causing morbidities disease (vyadhi). Their state of equilibrium is one of the important pre-requisite for arogya (health).

The workshop began at 03:00 pm. Ms. Prageetha of II B.Sc. FSMD sang a devotional song and

invoked the blessings of God almighty. Ms. Athira.K Ph.D Research Scholar, Department of Food

Service Management and Dietetics extended the formal welcome address. Next as a recall session,

Ms.Shanmuga priya, Research Scholar, Department of Food Service Management and Dietetics

presented a brief report on the Ayurvedic Dietetics session held on October 03, 2023. she highlighted the

entire programme of the previous day. Ms. Miniitha Susan joseph, Research Scholar from the Department

of Food Service Management and Dietetics, introduced the chief guest of the day Dr. Aramya, AR Senior

Research Associate and Senior Physician, AVP Research Foundation

Dr. Aramya presented on the title, Concept of diet and dietetic principles in Ayurveda. Mam

in her lecture highlighted the important concepts like: Concept of ahara and its importance, Processing

of food / Cooking, Importance of cooking, Factors that take part in digestion, Wholesomeness of food,

Tridosha and Aahara, Ahara dravya and their properties, Circadian rhythm, Intake and Proper time for

taking food, What happens if Food is taken in less & excess quantity, How Vata, Kapha and pitta people

should intake, Principles of Ahara (Dietetics), Method of taking meals, Daily indicated and

contraindicated Aahara. Mam started her presentation with a text by Chandyogyaupanishad, "Aharashuddhau Sattvashuddhih Sattvashuddhau Dhruva Smratih, Smratilambhe Sarvagranthinam Vipramokshah" which means Purity of food helps in purifying the inner self. Purification of the inner self and hence of the mind and intellect, accelerates elimination of illusions and ignorance.

Mam highlighted food as medicine which is "Aharam Mahabhishajyam". Ahara means Food, Maha means Great and Bhaishajyam means Medicine. Ahara is that which is fulfilling, immediately improving the strength, increases the bodily mass, longevity and digestion. It improves the enthusiasm, memory and ojas. In the presentation mam stated Āhāra is classified into six kinds according to the 17th century Bhojanakutūhala. According to Raghunātha foodstuffs (āhāra) are of six types on the basis of the process by which they are in-taken, They are coṣya, peya, rasālā, polikā, laḍḍuka and carvya.

Mam also presented the different Processing of food & Cooking and Importance of cooking according to ayurveda. The Wholesomeness of food such as Ekanta-Hitha, Ekantha Ahitha and Hitha —Ahitha were briefed with many examples. The circadian rhythm, ad libitium eating and time-restricted eating was elucidated with ease. The aspects of vata, kapha and pitta and its association with foods were clearely discussed .Finally mam concluded with the effects of measured diet which depicted the signs of food eaten in required quantity.



digestion and metabolism, which involves the act of ingestion of food till it gets completely

assimilated. The types of Agni (Jatharagni, Dhatuagni and Bhutagni) and the important of

Jatharagni – the digestive power or capacity of stomach, its types based on the Prakriti of the

individual. Sir, highlighted several benefits of identifying the Digestive power - Agni of the

individual improves the Ayu (Vitality), Varna (Complexion), Svasthyam (General Health),

Growth and Repair of body, Ojas, Tejas and Several pathologies of reduction – Agnimandyam

the temporary reduction of digestive power, which results in 'Ama' – different manifestation of

indigestion, 'Utara' - Ascitis, 'Arsas'- Piles or Haemorroids and Atyagni - increased Agni which

results in Ulcers.

Also, the relationship between the seasons and variations in digestive power and the variation during

post therapy period ie., Rasayana and Samsarjana krama. Seasonal adaptation (Ritusatmya) is described

under seasonal regimen (ritucharya), which is the variation in diet (ahara) and lifestyle (vihara) to

balance rhythmic seasonal variations of dosha, bala, agni, and rasa etc. through the concept of samanya

and vishesha. Knowledge and regular observance of suitable ritucharya (ahara and vihara for different seasons) is mainly for the maintenance of health and prevention of diseases. For diseased persons ritucharya need to be modified accordingly.

The samsarjana krama involves gradual increase or strengthening of 'Agni' – Digestive power. Importantly, sir llustrated the Agni – digestive power with several examples such as Basal Metabolic Rate, Gut Microbiota – a booming area of science for our better understanding. The session ends with an active question and answer session, sir clarifies the each and every doubt with patience to indulge the concept of agni and its influence in diet consumption in daily life.



On 6th of October, 2023, the final day of Workshop on Ayurvedic Dietetics commenced by 2 PM

at Foods Lab of Department of Food Service Management and Dietetics by invoking God's presence

through a prayer song led by Ms. Prageetha, II B.Sc FSMD.

The AVP Research team had planned for a live demonstration class wherein easily prepared recipes

were taught. These recipes are usually prepared in very less time, and can be given to patients with

certain conditions to improve their nutritional status. A formal introduction about the day's plan was

given by Dr. Aramya, Senior Research Associate and Senior physician, and Dr. Rahul, Consultant

Research Associate.

All the required ingredients for the preparation of therapeutic diets like rice, green gram, tender

coconut water, jaggery, banana, brinjal and few spices were all placed ready. The research scholars of

FSMD took active participation in the preparation of various recipes as instructed by the AVP Research

team. As and when the recipes were prepared, the team had elaborated on the benefits and conditions

in which the recipe could to be given to patients.

The very first demonstration was preparation of Manda, Peya, Vilepm and Odhanu, which are all rice-

based kanji's with 16 parts, six parts and four parts of water. The team had elaborated that to start oral

feeds to patients, his recipe is first provided and they ae slowly transitioned to soft diet. The water

content helps in providing nourishment, electrolyte balance and energy to the body. Similarly, twelve

parts of rice and two parts of green gram dhal was cooked together with spices like pepper, salt, turmeric

powder and asafoetida, which is called as Krshara was prepared. It helps to relieve gastritis and helps in having normal bowel movements. Likewise, a recipe using Ash gourd and jaggery was prepared, which is a well-known diuretic, cold in nature, and helps in relieving Pita dosha. Few other simple recipes using brinjal, neem flower and banana was prepared which all has therapeutic properties like wound healing, reduces bleeding disorders, digestive disorders etc... Usage of ingredients like turmeric, pepper, fenugreek, dry ginger, cardamom, neem flowers, neem leaves, butter milk, jaggery, curry leaves, sesame seeds, dry grapes, amla, melted ghee, coconut oil etc... can be increased in day to day meals, as it has many medicinal properties.

The major key point as explained by the AVP research team was that, whatever be the food or ingredient, it has to be consumed the right way at the right time for it to give major benefits in the body. Especially in case of consuming fats or lipids like coconut oil and ghee, it gives major benefits as it is the only medium which crosses the blood brain barrier. The team had also explained the importance of consuming natural, traditional and local foods available in the particular region. Also, the right choice of ingredients can help in keeping a balance of Vata, Pita and Kapha as it in important for overall health and well being.

Towards the end of the programme, question and answer session was done, in which the students of II M.Sc FSMD, PG Diploma, Research Scholars as well the teachers from the department had raised many interesting questions to the AVP Research team. A total of 54 beneficiaries were benefitted through the demonstration.

A novel perspective on dietetics can be gained by the four-day workshop on **Ayurvedic dietetics**. An traditional and scientific approach on diet prescription through the insights on matter (dravya), the human body's composition, and the five fundamental elements (panchamahabhuta), the vata, pitta, and kapha and their roles in health and illness, the digestive power of Agni, and diet variations based on

Agni, season, treatment, and circadian rhythm was made. Demonstration session at the end of the workshop assist to indulge ayurvedic principles in daily life.

Greetings by Dr. V. Premala Priyadarshini, Head of the Department, Food Service Management and Dietetics

The workshop started with Dr. Somit Kumar CSO and Director of AVP Research Foundation, who introduced the principles of ayurveda to the students. He started the session explaining the definition of Ayurveda. Ayurveda, is the structured definition of life. Ayur means life, and Veda means knowledge. Every individual must have the knowledge about the life they live. He emphasised the importance of experimenting everything in science and to observe it, to know the truth behind the theory.

Dr. Somit Kumar also elaborated the classification of organisms according to Ayurveda. The beautiful science of Ayurveda has 5 elements of life as earth, water, fire, air and sky. It was fascinating to learn how diet is prescribed in Ayurveda. Diet in Ayurveda depends on the 5 elements of life and it tries to meet a balance in all these elements of life to stay healthy.

Also, a very good explanation about the food consumption and the human body metabolism in accordance with the seasonal changes was deliberated.

Dr. Aramya, Senior research associate, AVP Research foundation the 2nd speaker of the day took over the stage, where the ayurvedic eating practices and benefits of ayurvedic diet was enlightened. Ahara means something that gives immense strength. The concept of Ahara and its importance was given in śrāvakācāra, which is a 11th century book. It classifies foods in varies means and that was really an interesting concept to know. The basic idea of food and the importance of following the ayurvedic concept was explained very clearly by Dr. Aramya. Taking warm food with an emulsifier enhances the digestion and the absorption of food. It is very much important to follow the food limit during our meal.

Ayurveda has a $1/3^{rd}$ rule of food. The rule says our stomach should be filled with $1/3^{rd}$ of solid, $1/3^{rd}$ of liquid and $1/3^{rd}$ of air in every meal. She highlighted the major factors of the food. Ayurveda has 8 major factors of food as, the quality of food, combination of food, method of cooking, quantity habits and so on. All these factors and the diet itself is completely based on the 5 basic elements of life spelled in Ayurveda. It was very interesting to know the food facts in Ayurveda. The session was an eye opener to all the participants.

REPORT

REPORT




The training session was attended by 320 participants from diverse age groups and fitness levels.
