


period of time. At the same time, Oviya showed her patriotism by wearing an outfit which symbolized the "National Flag Color" saffron, white & green.





Many elements of Indian culture, such as Indian religions, mathematics, philosophy, cuisine, languages, dance, music and movies have had a profound impact across the Indosphere, Greater India and the world. Specifically Southeast Asian and Himalayan influence on early India, had lasting impacts on the formation of Hinduism and Indian mythology. Hinduism itself formed from various distinct folk religions, which merged during the Vedic period and following periods. Especially Austroasiatic groups, such as early Munda and Mon Khmer, but also Tibetic and other Tibeto-Burmese groups, left noteworthy influence on local Indian peoples and culture. Several scholars, such as Professor Przyluski, among others,

concluded that there is a significant cultural, linguistic, and political Mon-Khmer (Austroasiatic) influence on early India, which can also be observed by Austroasiatic loanwords within Indo-Aryan languages and rice cultivation, which was introduced by East/Southeast Asian rice-agriculturalists using a route from Southeast Asia through Northeast India into the Indian subcontinent. The British Raj further influenced Indian culture, such as through the widespread introduction of the English language, and a local dialect developed.









Forest Museum

Iconic 120-year-old Gass Forest Museum is a record of the history of the land, lovingly curated for over a century. A giant stuffed Indian Gaur from the Biligiri Hills of Karnataka greets you even before you enter the towering two-tiered Gothic-style mansion that holds one of India's largest and oldest natural history collections.the gaur displayed at the main exhibition room was presented in 1956 by Jayachamaraja Wodeyar, the last Maharaja of the princely state of Mysore while the 14-month and four-month elephant foetuses were gifted by renowned 'elephant doctor' V. Krishnamurthy, who performed the highest number of elephant post-mortems. The gaur is accompanied by various other stuffed animals including the great Indian hornbill, Nilgiri langur, slender lorris, and birds. There is also a skeleton section with the skeleton of an elephant and a bull. "It's a museum within a museum as the colonial building was built specifically for this purpose. The height of the

ceiling was raised to accommodate a massive sandalwood trunk that weighs 1.75 tonnes and is 10.2 metres tall". The entomology section has insects, beetles and butterflies on pins that have been in mahogany display cases for more than a century. "I noticed marbled map, a butterfly species that is distributed across South East Asia up to north east India till Andhra. Other rare species are autumn leaf and five band swordtail". The mycology section has fungal species that occur in the forests and have an important role to play in the growth of trees. While the wildlife artefacts are disturbed only to polish, periodically change formalin and maintain moisture content, the seeds, soils and fungi collections are updated regularly.

Toward the end of the 19th century, an aborted attempt was made by J. A. Gamble, the conservator of forests for Madras Presidency, to establish a forest museum in the province. A few years later in 1902, Gamble's successor as Conservator of Forests Horace Arichibald Gass succeeded in establishing a museum for forestry. It was opened to the public 15 April 1902 by Baron Ampthill, the then Governor of Madras, at that point simply referred to as the Forest Museum at Coimbatore. When Gass, the first curator, retired in 1905, his successor F. A. Lodge renamed the museum in his honor. It was expanded in 1905 and 1915. In 1912, the

Madras Forestry College (currently the Tamil Nadu Forest Academy) was established in the museum grounds to train foresters. During 1942–47, the museum was closed and the buildings used as shelters for World War II evacuees from Malta and Greece. After Indian Independence in 1947, the museum came under the administration Government of Tamil Nadu. It is currently run by the Institute of Forest Genetics and Tree Breeding (IFGTB), which is situated in the same campus. The museum was reopened for public on 1 May 2015 after carrying out renovation works.

FIELD VISIT – THE GASS FOREST MUSEUM

On September 9th, 2022, we visited the gass forest museum with our class tutors. Itwas a very good experience, it was 1 km away from our college. The Gass Forest Museum is a government-run natural history museumsituated in Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu, and India. Located at CowleyBrownRoad,it isoneofthepopularmuseums inTamilnadu.



Gass Forest Museum is located inside the premises of the Forest



College Campus, Coimbatore. J. A. Gamble, the conservator offorests for the Madras Presidency, made an aborted attempt toestablish a forest museum in the province towards the end of the19th century. A few years later in1902, Gamble's successor, Horace Archibald Gass, succeeded in establishing amuse umfor forestry. During World War-II, the museum was closed to accommodate evacuees from Greece and Malta.



After Indian Independence in 1947, the museum came under the administration Government of Tamil Nadu and is currently run by the Institute of Forest Genetics and Tree Breeding (IFGTB). The museum was reopened for the publicon 1st May 2015 after carrying out

renovation works. Initially, the museum was started in one of the rooms of the

conservator's office building and was expanded and shifted thepresent building in the year 1915. It is made of red stone and built-in British Gothic style. The museum home to nearly 10000exhibits.Ofther areartifacts in the



museum is a piece of an asteroid which is believed to be several million years old, a stuffedalbino crow, and a full-grown male stuffed Indian guar which wasgifted to the museum in 1956 by Jayachamaraja Wodeyar, the lastMaharaja of the princely state of Mysore. One can see an assortment of stuffed animals and birds including an attentiongrabbingoneofa Brahminkitecapturing a click. This natural history museum is the first institution in India to houseexhibits related to forestry. The forestry artifacts here includetimber, non-timber forest products, wood crafts, wildlife, entomology, mycology, geology, ethnology, arms, forestengineering, and the environment. In total the museum hosts 10,000 different of artifacts. types Peopleliketoseethestuffedanimalsandreptilesthatlookverymuchalive. A stuffed wild Bison along with a sloth and a deer stand at theentrance of the museum. Apart from this one can see the stuffedanimals like peacock, leopard, bramhini kite and others. One of thegreat

attractions of this museum is the preserved baby elephant's fetus, stuffed baby elephant and skeleton of the elephant. Those wholove to explore nature, this museum is a great break. History- The Gass Forest Museum was established by Horace Archibald Gass, a British Forest Officer. There were more than 4000 exhibits housed under following categories:

Wildlife

The museum housed a rich collection on wildlife. Field Visit to Gass Forest Museum

Date: September 9,2022

There was a field trip arranged for the 1st under graduate students to the Forest Gass Museum. 1st B.Sc. Information Technology along with 1st B.Sc. Computer Science and 1st Viscom were taken to the museum. We started at 2:00 p.m. from the University and reached the museum in a few minutes. There was a small introduction about the museum given by the instructor and also she explained about the founder of the museum Sir.Horace Arichibald Gass.

A taxidermied wild boar was kept at the entrance, everybody looked at it in amusement. There were many animals and birds mummified some of them were a cheetah, some monkeys, rats, eagles, fox, rabbits and so on. Many birds were taxidermied and their wings were kept for display. Animal skins were kept in glass containers along with their other body parts. Skeletons of many mammals and also humans were kept. Not only animals and birds but also plants and trees are preserved in the museum. Some rare seeds of fruits and also traditional plants were kept in preserving liquids.

All were glued to a baby elephant of 14 months in a big glass container with preserving liquid. There were also skins of snakes taken after they were removed by their natural process. Apart from wildlife there were traditional weapons and clothes used by the forest tribes at the 1st floor. Guns, bow and arrows, boomerangs and other weapons used by the tribal people and the forest guards were displayed. Clothing and accessories of the tribes and the uniforms of guards were kept. Model of huts of the local tribes and other different houses, working models of bridges etc made everyone look at it with excitement. Types of rocks, minerals, fungi, corals were preserved.

After having a look at the Gass museum it was time for us to leave. Everybody came out with contentment and by gaining knowledge. We completed the visit at 3:30 p.m. The outcome of this field visit was great as everyone appreciated the conservation of nature and vowed of preserving and conserving the ecosystem by themselves to protect the environment on the whole.

The Gass Forest Museum was established by Horace Archibald Gass, a British Forest Officer. More than 4000 exhibits housed in the museum under different categories including, wildlife, preservation of seeds and fruits of various plants, timbers, insects, geological area,





fungal preservation, non-timber forest products, traditional products and wood crafts. The students were fascinated on each collection exhibited in the museum. Many endangered species and their skeletons were preserved in formalin. Foetus of elephant and eggs of different birds were quite interesting to the students. They all were enjoyed and explored the nature around them. Several kinds of bamboos and canes were observed by the students. The 467 years old cross-sectional teak and a sandal tree with the height 10.2 meter and weight 1.75 tonnes were also be showcased. Colourful and venomous insects were displayed behind the transparent glass shield. From this, students can understand the biodiversity of important species. More than 300 geologically important components including rock, minerals and soils were also displayed in the museum. Attractable wooden based products manufactured with the application of forest tree including, bobbins, carving things, etc., were housed in this Gass forest museum. Clothes and traditional weapons used by the ancient tribal people were very new to the students. They excited to see all the models of huts, houses and bridges used by the tribes. Students were feel happy to explored the nature one day. Form this local visit, they

came to know that conservation and preservation of our tradition is crucial part of our life. We need to protect the environment and culture.
