

WEBINAR ON CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE

A webinar on child sexual abuse for NSS volunteers of School of Home Science was organized by the Department of Human development. The webinar was conducted on 4th August 2022 at 3.30 pm to 4.30 pm through online mode. A total of 86 NSS volunteers, POs and APOs joined the webinar. Mrs.S. Vidhya, Centre Administrator, one stop centre, District Social Welfare office, Namakkal was invited as the speaker for the event. The objective of the lecture was to make students have sexual awareness. The speaker started with defining sexual abuse. Sexual abuse is unwanted sexual activity with perpetrators who use force, make threats or take advantage of victims without consent. Most victims and perpetrators know each other. Immediate reactions to sexual abuse include shock and fear or disbelief. Long-term symptoms include anxiety, fear or post-traumatic stress disorder. While efforts to treat sex offenders remain unpromising, psychological interventions for survivors — especially group therapy — appears effective. The speaker continued to speak on child sexual abuse, which is also called as child molestation, where an adult or older adolescent uses a child for sexual stimulation. Forms of child sexual abuse include engaging in sexual activities with a child (whether by asking or pressuring, or by other means), indecent exposure (of the genitals, female nipples, etc.), child grooming, and child sexual exploitation, including using a child to produce child pornography.

The speaker spoke about two main types of child sexual abuse: touching and non-



touching. Touching includes touching a child's genitals, making a child touch someone else's genitals, playing sexual games etc for sexual pleasure. Non-touching abuse includes showing pornography to a child, exposing a person's genitals to a child etc. She also threw light on the facts about child sexual abuse like for every nine minutes child protective services substantiates, or finds evidence for, a claim of child sexual abuse, over 65,000 children are abused in the United States each year and approximately one in four adult women and one in thirteen men were abused sexually as children. She

also mentioned about the impact on a person's physical and mental health such as unplanned pregnancies, chronic health conditions such as obesity or cancer, depression and PTSD, substance abuse and increased risk of suicide. Finally, she spoke about prevention of child abuse. She gave some important points like, get involved with community-based prevention efforts, seek more information about how to prevent abuse and keep children safe, protect your own children, support child abuse victims, teach others about child abuse prevention and report suspected child abuse. The session ended with an interaction between students and the speaker. The coordination of students and teachers made the session a successful one.


