

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1. PREFACE

The Communication Skills Centre functioning with an aim to elevate and enrich the holistic personality of the students by upgrading their skill sets, conducted the Skill Based Courses categorized under Part –IV component of the Undergraduate scheme. The courses are directed by the Coordinator- Communication & Soft Skills and handled by the in-house Team of Trainers- including newly appointed 4 trainers and 1 existing trainer.



During the EVEN semester of the academic year 2023-24, the III UG students-2021 batch & the I B.Ed & B.P.Ed students- 2023 batch were offered "Soft Skills" (23BSSS01/23BDSS01) course, while the III B.E students were offered "Communication Skills"(23BECS01) with 2 hours of instruction per week. The trainers worked based on a pre-planned schedule and batch allotment for the 1600 students of III UG - 2021 batch and 110 students of Iyr B.Ed & B.P.Ed.

The mark entry for both CIA & CE of all the students was completed by the team before the date given for CIA entry by 09.05.2024.





9. STUDENTS' FEEDBACK


The students' feedback on the various aspects of the Soft Skills training is as follows.




82% of the students agree that the training has helped them improve their interpersonal skills which is key to Soft Skills development
